### 56th ANNUAL PRESIDENTIAL REPORT

### Year-ended 31 October 2008

2008 has been by most measures another successful year for the Hamilton Contract Bridge Club, and I am indebted to all those who have contributed to this success. Perhaps though this success has been overshadowed by the 2 burglaries which happened in the middle of the year. This was most unfortunate for us as a club and was the first ever which perhaps reflects a sign of recent times where this type of happening is occurring far too often. However it is behind us now and we have done our utmost to ensure that it won't happen again. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the members for their patience during the time it took to get back to some form of normality.

### Membership

Once again we have managed to maintain our membership numbers with very little change from 2007. Our membership stands at 346 compared with 339 in 2007.

### **Bridgemates**

We appear to have overcome the few glitches experienced in the first few months of using Bridgemates thanks to Jan Spaans. He has spent endless hours in ensuring the smooth running of these especially in Swiss Pairs and Teams events and now has everything under control. They are still not in use on Tuesday Afternoons and Friday Mornings sessions and this will continue to be so for a while to come.

### Services

During the year we had to remove the trees from the centre strip as they were causing blockages and also a burst pipe. Hopefully this has solved these problems as it was not done lightly. However, once again we have had problems with the sewer pipe so we will definitely have to have this fixed permanently now as there is no point in continually having to pay out money without actually fixing the problem for good. It will be an expensive exercise but that should be the end of it.

We have had to install a new alarm system as a result of the burglary. The previous one was ineffectual in the event of the telephone lines being cut so we now have a wireless system which does not require the telephone line. We have also had deadlocks installed on the doors throughout the building and an aluminium grill over the scoring room window.

### **Fund Raising**

The Club's funds have benefited considerably from car parking for Waikato Stadium, raffles, sales table and hiring of the building. The parking for the V8s in April was a very worthwhile event for us financially. In October/November we also hired out the Secretary's office to FIFA for the Women's World Cup Soccer Tournament for a period of 4 weeks. All of the above have helped our funds enormously especially after the burglary which cost us quite considerably.

We were successful in obtaining a grant from the Perrry Foundation for the remarking of the carpark.

### Lessons

We had a great attendance of around 35 to the Beginners' Lessons with 16 joining the Club as a result. I would like to thank Richard Fletcher for his excellent tuition but regret that he will not be available for next year. However Jenny Millington and Barry Jones have agreed to run them again, so we will once again have excellent tutors.

### **Social Events**

These have not been as well attended this year as previously but we will continue to have them but maybe not as often.

### **Tournaments and Events**

We had 16 tables at the 2007 AGM and dinner (17 in 2006)

The Waikato Championship Open 5A attracted 11 tables (14 in 2007)

At the end of April the Hamilton Ladies Open attracted 11 tables (14) and the Intermediate 10 (10). The Hamilton Restricted 8B Tournament had 13 tables which was the same as 2007.

The Hamilton Swiss Pairs Open 5A had 34 pairs (28 in 2007)

The Hamilton Congress at Labour Weekend was once again a great success with 20 tables (18 in 2007) in the Open 10A Pairs, 20 teams (18) in the Provincial Teams and 13 tables (10) in the Consolation Open 3A Pairs. The Congress was very well managed once again by Malcolm Smith ably assisted by Jan Spaans, while Val West and her team once again did a superb job providing meals.

Melbourne Cup Day was once again an enjoyable day with 17 tables (19 in 2007)

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2008

#### 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The General Accounting Policies recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of income and financial position on an historical cost basis have been consistently followed, except that buildings are recorded at valuation.

Reliance is placed on the fact that the Club is a going concern

Financial figures are shown exclusive of GST.

The Club qualifies for differential reporting as it is not publicly accountable and the Club is not "large" according to the Framework for Differential Reporting.

The Club has taken advantage of all available differential reporting exemptions.

Minor capital items are written off when incurred. No expenditure has been capitalised. There have been no material changes in Accounting Policies since the previous Annual

Financial Statements.

### 2. PROPERTY

### 3. DEPRECIATION and MINOR CAPITAL WORKS

Apart from assessed depreciation on Furniture & Fittings, no Depreciation is charged in the Accounts as the Clubs policy is to write off each year all maintenance items, together with charges which can be regarded as minor capital works.

In common with other organisations of a similar nature, control over income prior to it being recorded is limited, and there are no pratical audit procedures to determine the effect of this limited control. Subject to the possible effect of the limited control over income referred to, in my opinion the Financial Statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the HAMILTON CONTRACT BRIDGE CLUB INC as at 31 October 2008 and the result of its activities for the year ended on that date.

## FINANCIAL REPORT

## Year Ended 31 October 2008

Statement of Financial Performance for year ended 31 October 2008 discloses an operating surplus of \$1,973, a decrease of \$4,163 on the previous year.

Income excluding grants increased by \$4,392 to that of the previous year. Building hire, car parking, raffles and the sales table contributed \$9,523. This is bonus income for the Club.

ANZ Bank term deposits total \$44,721. Interest on these investments was \$4,100, showing an increase of \$898.

One grant was received from the Lion Foundation of \$1,340 for car park painting.

Expenses were once again well-contained. Extra expenses incurred were due to the burglaries. Two new doors with dead-locks were installed to the scoring room and Secretary's office. A new security system has also been installed. The NZ Bridge Master Points Levy for this year was \$5,203, an increase of \$3,231.

The Hamilton Contract Bridge Club building is a superior venue and must be maintained to a high standard. This coming year re-furbishment of the front entrance would be very desirable.

Finally, the Club is in a sound financial position and there will be no increase in subscriptions or table money.
