Annual General Meeting November 2011

During the latter part of 2010 discussions took place regarding the renovation of the Bridge Club foyer.

Earlier in the year we were extremely fortunate to receive the offer of a very generous donation tagged specifically for the purpose of modernising this area in keeping with the still very modern aspect of the rest of the building.

After initial contact with builders we were unexpectedly confronted with having to remove asbestos and then the restoration of the ceiling in the hallway and toilet areas. This work was completed during the holiday period to cause members as little inconvenience as possible.

After confirming our preferred builder (three quotes were sought) and work to be done the job finally began in May 2011.

As can be seen a considerable amount of work has resulted. Apart from construction, painting and electrical work a sample of some of the other work undertaken was employing an interior decorator, having skylights replaced, new tiling, textured wallpaper hung and painted and new automatic sliding doors to allow easier access for members especially those with walkers and wheelchairs.

Numerous other items needed to be included and an added extra was the use of the old doors to enclose the back porch beside the kitchen providing us with an excellent storage area and preventing the tedious problem of squatters.

In completing this part of my report I would on behalf of our Hamilton Bridge Club members like to thank our benefactor who enabled us to even consider these renovations. The comments received from members and from players from throughout New Zealand have certainly proved that this project has been a HUGE accomplishment. To Richard Loughnan we also owe our sincere thanks for his generosity of time and effort in ensuring the success of our alterations from the initial planning to the final completed result.

Thank you, Richard, from myself and our Club members ...your input has been tireless.

MEMBERSHIP

Our membership number of 303 is unfortunately 24 members less than last year's report.. We had 30 new members join the club of which 22 were beginners.

It will be vital in the years ahead for each of us to vigorously encourage people we know...family, friends, colleagues and neighbours to attend the lessons so as to ensure the growth of our Club as this will be the only way that our Club will continue to be as successful as we would all wish it to be.

LESSONS

Once again without the excellent lessons organised and tutored by Jenny Millington our membership numbers would have been reduced considerably.

With Richard Fletcher at the helm the sampler lesson to basically introduce the learners to the game of bridge continued this year.

Jenny continued with extra sessions after completion of the lessons which gave the learners considerably more confidence when joining the Tuesday night players.

Jenny and her husband Barry Jones continued sharing their expertise with youth players and those wishing to participate in tournaments.

With encouragement from Jenny and Barry, Kieran Mangan and Kimberly Yeoman --- 2010 learners were selected as part of the Waikato Youth team to play at New Zealand Congress.

Jenny and Barry, our sincere thanks to you both for the commitment you have made again this year.

To your regular team of helpers at the lessons, and there are several, thank you also for your invaluable assistance.

I would like to make a special mention of thanks to Blair Fisher who assisted at every lesson (apart from the evening of his wedding anniversary!!). I have been told that his manner and teaching abilities have been extremely encouraging for all our new players.

FUNDRAISING

Many other smaller assets have been purchased .. .e.g. a network printer, replacement furniture for the Secretary's office, lighting in car park modified.

A sincere thanks to all members who have helped our Club towards a viable and ever changing future.

In the near future Patricia Thomson will be assisting with some replanting as may be necessary.

My greatest disappointment this year was in having to cancel two social events arranged especially for the members of the Club.

One was the Irish evening for St Patrick's Day, the other a Charity event for Plunket.

As we run many outside Tournaments I believed that our older members who tend not to participate in two session events should be catered for on other occasions and these one session events were organised with that in mind...one early evening and one during the day.

As Plunket had been requested to provide lunch for the Charity event and all proceeds were to be given to them I was very grateful to at least be able to take over to them \$240.00 being proceeds from a raffle and from the sale of greeting cards.

Thank you to those who supported the raffle and to Cynthia Clayton a BIG thank you for making and donating all proceeds from those beautiful cards.

Restoring my faith in organising special events was the great success of Melbourne Cup Day and I was delighted to see so many staying after play to watch the battle for the Melbourne Cup.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2011

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The General Accounting Policies recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of income and financial position on an historical cost basis have been consistently followed, except that buildings are recorded at valuation. Reliance is placed on the fact that the Club is a going concern. Financial figures are shown exclusive of GST. The Club qualifies for differential reporting as it is not publicly accountable and the Club is not "large" according to the Framework for Differential Reporting. The Club has taken advantage of all available differential reporting exemptions. Minor capital items are written off when incurred. No expenditure has been capitalised. There have been no material changes in Accounting Policies since the previous Annual Financial Statements.

No Depreciation is charged in the Accounts as the Club's policy is to write off each year all maintenance items, together with charges which can be regarded as minor capital works.

I have audited the financial statements of the HAMILTON CONTRACT BRIDGE CLUB INC in accordance with accepted accounting standards, having carried out such procedures as I considered necessary. In common with other organisations of a similar nature, control over income prior to it being recorded is limited, and there are no practical audit procedures to determine the effect of this limited control. I have also checked the payment records where accounts are certified by a member of the Executive Committee and the Secretary. Subject to the above, in my opinion the Financial Statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Hamilton Contract Bridge Club Inc as a 31 October 2011.

Treasurers Report for the year ended 31st October 2011

The attached Financial accounts show the club has a deficit of \$8,275 for the year against a surplus of \$4,459 for the previous year. The main reason for the extra spending was the club portion of the entrance way upgrade. If this was excluded the accounts show an deficit or loss of \$498

Membership Fees slightly decreased compared to last year and table money is down on the previous year as well. Interest received is up due to slightly better interest rates on our term deposits.

Most expenses have remained at similar levels to last year with the exception of property repairs and maintenance. The old front doors were moved around to the kitchen area, to make an extra storage area and discourage homeless people.

The entrance way was upgraded at a cost of \$47,777. This was funded by an anonymous donation of \$40,000 and the balance of \$7,777 funded by the club

The Club received no Grants for this financial year.

The club still has good cash reserves, however there are a number of maintenance issues looming, which will need significant expenditure. These include the resealing of the front car park, replacement of the fascia around the outside of the building and investigation of the heating system to ensure it is viable to keep maintaining.
