Presidents Annual Report 2023

As we look to close off 2023, I have some good projects in mind for next year to bring some freshness into and also to revamp the Club though I want to bring up why we are here...

What are the objects of the Bridge Club you may ask – well the Constitution records these as follows:

The objects of the Club are those charitable objects and purposes which are recognised by the Courts of New Zealand and including:

- a. Teaching and providing amenities, facilities and equipment for playing the game of contract bridge and for any other like purpose that its members may decide
- b. Promoting contract bridge tournaments, competitions and matches and providing for the control, administration and management of bridge sessions and events,
- c. The provision and maintenance of premises considered necessary desirable or convenient for the advancement of such objects.

And to complete these obligations, we need a committee to nurture, grow and improve our members experience, provide a positive playing environment, deliver sessions to advance skill levels, to encourage new members and grow the existing membership and to maintain our building and keep the 'books' in the black

You will see that 2023 finishes on a high note recovering from the Covid sucker which yay, the financials confirm the turnaround

Over the year we have been blessed with the external incomes from car parking - Richard Wagstaff and all of his team must be congratulated on the time they have given for the Waikato Rugby events and of course from the FIFA programme that was a \$5,000 additional bonus to the Club – almost \$25k has been earned so far

The Club also received a donation of \$10,000 from the Shirley Waymouth whanau with no stipulations placed on how we send these funds – we have used \$1,000 on the new entrance sign dedicated to Shirley, to acknowledge her history and commitment to Bridge, both in Hamilton and NZ bridge

We are considering how to best utilise these funds in the future and it will be something tangible to add onto or improve our facilities

At this stage we do not have a committee to move into 2024, yet we do have a Plan B until we return in February – we require a minimum of 5 committee members and at this stage we have only 4 nominations

I encourage you all to think about what you can do for your Club – we need a committee, without one, our operation will cease and we can't have that happen I will be calling for nominations from the floor and the commitment is minimal as we have a good smattering of volunteers to call on to assist with events

With our large membership, it really is something that should not be a problem yet alas here we are in this awkward situation

Over this year, your committee has ticked off a number of achievements

The roof is currently under refurbishment and currently have ben washed, treated for moss, about to be sealed

Secured 4 grants to improve the lady's accessible toilet and for roof repairs

Celebrated our 70th Jubilee anniversary

Improved our plumbing situation (we were experiencing multiple blockages)

Men's and ladies' toilets have been deep cleaned

Streamlined our Compa\$\$ transactions for easier management

Refreshed the internal skirting by painting

Completed the initial steps for replacing the carpet in both rooms

Improved our external security lighting by adding more lights

Completed a review of our Constitution – thanks to Dave Edson and Hugh Barton for the enormous amount of time spent to ensure we are complaint when the new Inc Soc Act 2025 comes in and we will be seeking adoption of various changes and upgrades by giving the members time to review the workings and to provide any feedback

Conducted 2 sets of beginner lessons and 2 sets of Improver lessons for club members – thanks to Cherie Barton and Richard Hooper

Agreed to keep updating the honours boards

Secured the hire of our building over the festive season whilst the Club is unattended

Well done to Barry Jones and Jenny Millington for New Zealand selection to Morocco this year

Blair and Liz Fisher were initially selected and for personal reasons were unable to attend - they currently lead the Baden Wilson list for the most A points gained for male and female as at October 2023 in New Zealand – congrats on this achievement

Thanks to the committee this year, Cheire Barton, Chris Goulding, Dave Edson, Hugh Barton, Laura Sommerville, Michael Davies, Richard Wagstaff – your contributions to the Club has made an impact

To the Directors and Tutors and their assistants – a job well done

And to the partner stewards, thanks for being there for the players

Thanks to Cherie, our Treasurer and Julie Club secretary, both valuable crew members

2024 looks to be a good year and once again we look to hosting some tournaments online

This medium is proving very popular and we could utilise more than one tournament in this format so we will review the programme and seek authorisation from NZB early next year

We have confirmed to continue as normal with the Thursday night session and will trial a Monday session, possibly start in the morning and break for lunch then play the remaining boards

Keep an eye out for this

The projects in mind for next year are carpet replacement, update of bridge mates – purchase of additional ones and refit of ones that are out of action, refresh of internal walls and noticeboards placement, upgrade of bar and kitchen areas including possible relocation of scoring room

The place will look upbeat and polished and continue to be a fantastic asset so join me on the committee to ensure that we continue to be the best Club we can be

My final words go to Vice President, Richard Wagstaff who has been a stellar member of the Club and the amount of work that he completes is truly unbelievable

Improve lighting in front and rear car park in time for womens world cup football event. Led lighting Richmond room, kitchen, scorer room, ladies room. (Thanks Don Weston, Brett Glass) \$2,600

Replace mens basin faucets. \$680

Assessable Toilet renovation with funding from City Council (\$3700)

Major repair to unblocking and removing tree roots to main sewer pipe. FB Hall (\$4500)

Clear storm water drains at front car park (\$450). (an annual task)

Fit a downpipe near secretary car park to redirect storm water from internal roof. \$750 Roof Coatings Ltd presently retexturing the decramastic Roofs and repainting Turrets funded jointly from Pub Charity Ltd, Wel Energy, Trust Waikato and Club funds totaling \$16000 Clean Boss polish rest room floors \$850
